1 Introduction

Brief Introduction

- Established in 1996 and started disseminating raw data in 1998.
- Authorized by JSPS as one of the commissioned research institutions for "Program for Constructing Data Infrastructure for the Humanities and Social Sciences" (FY2018 FY2023)
 - Develops and enhances research data infrastructure for collecting research data, creating metadata, and facilitating data sharing.
- Authorized by JSPS as a core institution for "Program for Strengthening Data Infrastructure for the Humanities and Social" (FY2023 - FY2027)
 - Collaborates with other institutions to continue promoting the utilization of research data and data infrastructure for the humanities and social sciences.

Data Collection

- SSJDA holds the most extensive research survey data in Japan in social science.
- Data collection: more than 2,500 datasets
- Data from approximately 1,700 surveys are now available.

Translation into English

- Translation of metadata
 - 1,157 translations available
- Translation of primary survey questionnaires and data labels
 - 70 survey data labels have been translated and released
 - Frequently used surveys
 - e.g.,
 - Social Stratification and Social Mobility Survey
 - Japanese Life Course Panel Survey of High School Graduates (JLPS-H)
 - Survey on Life Attitudes of Parents and Children

SSJDA Data Analysis

- Web application for conducting basic statistical analysis of social survey data online.
- Developed by the SSJDA in 2018, it has been publicly available since October 2022.
- Features
 - No registration or login required
 - No commands required
 - Fully equipped with such as descriptive analysis and cross-tabulation analysis, which are commonly used in social research education
- Usage (April to December 2023)
 - Number of accesses: 22,823
 - Number of analyses : 12,434
- Available datasets: 166





Unrestricted Public Pseudo-Data

- Pseudo-data created from actual data are now available for teaching and practice of analysis (available from October 2022).
- Based on actual data, 1,000 cases were randomly selected; variables were drastically reduced, and random noise was mixed into the responses.
- These data have no restrictions, and anyone can use them.
- Number of downloads from April to December 2023: 720



3 Education and Research Activities

Collect primary data

- Japanese Life Course Panel Surveys (JLPS)
 - JLPS for the youth group <JLPS-Y>, JLPS for the middle-aged group <JLPS-M> (2007—)
 - JLPS for high school graduates <JLPS-H> (2004 –)
 - JLPS for junior high school students <JLPS-J> (2015-)
- Call for Questionnaire Items for the SSJDA Panel Survey
 - CSRDA solicits research themes for the SSJDA Panel Survey as a project to promote joint research.
